USGA RULES GOVERN ALL PLAY
EXCEPT WHERE LOCAL RULES PREVAIL

- White stakes and fences define out-of-bounds.
- Red stakes define lateral water hazards.
- All roads, cart paths and railroad ties are obstructions. When ties or other man-made objects border a sand bunker, they are considered obstructions within the bunker. (Rule 24-2).
- All players must register in the Golf Shop and begin play on hole 1 unless otherwise authorized.
- Use the 90 degree rule unless instructed to remain on the cart path.
- Repair all ball marks and fill divots using the sand and seed bottle.
- The club expects and supports a 4-hour round of golf.
- The Country Club of Colorado is a non-metal spike facility.

COURSE HISTORY

In 1967, Charles Gates purchased 3,000 acres of land in southwest Colorado Springs that was known as Cheyenne Mountain Ranch. He had a vision that included a community of individual home sites, shopping centers, restaurants, hotels and areas for recreation.

The Country Club of Colorado was the focal point of that vision and in 1971, Gates Land Company selected Pete Dye as the architect to design and build their golf course around a spring-fed lake known as Curr Reservoir. The Club opened nine holes in the Fall of 1973 and from the beginning, the community and The Club were a success. In addition to a championship golf course, The Club's recreation program offers indoor and outdoor tennis, racquetball, squash, group exercise classes in a state-of-the-art fitness center, onsite spa and wellness retreat and water sports, including boat rentals on their private 35-acre lake, complete with white sandy beachfront. The main clubhouse includes the Pineview Grille Restaurant, family dining, an antique game room, golf shop and men's and women's locker rooms.

In 1985, the Cheyenne Mountain Resort was opened for business, catering to both the corporate world and leisure guests alike. The resort's 316 finely appointed guest-rooms and suites feature comfortable Rocky Mountain-inspired décor, while The Club's vast array of amenities provides an impressive range of year-round activity for travelers. Known for its breathtaking mountain views, exceptional accommodations, fine dining and comprehensive conference facilities, the AAA Four Diamond Cheyenne Mountain Resort is the ultimate basecamp destination for exploring Colorado Springs and endless Rocky Mountain adventures.
